INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF PLANET EARTH UPDATE October 2007

During the third quarter of 2007 the total number of IYPE National Committee increased to 48 nations. In addition, there is one conjoint IYPE Regional Committee (for East and Southeast Asia).

Preparations for the Global IYPE Launch Event at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris, on 12 and 13 February are in an advanced stage. We expect a maximum of 1000 invited guests, including some 300 young students from all parts of the world. In many countries the Student Contest has started. Rules and guidelines for the Contest are posted on the website. Keynote speakers have been selected for three Sessions: 'Population growth and Climate Change: challenges for Planet Earth', 'Earth resources: threat or treat?' and Geohazards: minimizing risk, maximizing awareness'. Leading politicians have agreed to participate and several keynote speakers have confirmed their participation.

Preparations for a second continent-wide IYPE Launch event, on 22 and 23 May, 2008 in Arusha, Tanzania, are in full swing. A preliminary Programme is available and a fundraising campaign has started. TOTAL promised to support the GLE in Paris with 140,000 USD and the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs has offered to support the participation of 22 students from developing countries. The Polish government, through State Secretary (and State Geologist) Mariusz Jedrysek, announced its support of the IYPE to the amount of 140,000 USD.

Two new International Partners, the Geological Survey of Italy (APAT) and the Society of Exploration Geophysicists (SEG), joined the IYPE, thus bringing the total number to 12.

The Science Programme Committee has evaluated 38 Expressions of Interest. Through the Secretariat, the Outreach Programme Committee received 37 Expressions of Interest. The website in now under conversion to a web portal.

The American Geological Institute (AGI) will, beginning with the November issue of Geotimes include the IYPE logo in all issues during the triennium. In addition, the AGI Executive Director will prepare an editorial focusing on the importance of IYPE as part of the January issue. AGI will also work with the U.S. National IYPE Committee to support any activities they have planned.

Nature will come with a new Journal: Nature Geoscience by January 2008 and Nature will produce a special supplement dedicated to the IYPE also in January. In February 2008, 100,000 copies of a special IYPE book will be issued and spread all around the world. In most of the nations, activities for IYPE will really take off early 2008, making it The Greatest Geo-Show on Earth!
