Biography:

I was born and live in Rome. Since my childhood, I've always been fascinated by the grandeur of geological phenomena on our living planet. This has fueled my deep passion for geology.

After the degree and PhD in Geological Sciences, my career focused on geological hazards and risks, including participation in emergency response efforts during earthquakes in Italy. Since 1999, I've been working as a researcher at the Italian Institute of Geophysics and Volcanology. My skills in geomorphology and engineering geology are addressed to analyse geomorphological and geotechnical aspects of seismic hazard. For around 15 years, I've been developing geoethics research, exploring the ethical, social, and cultural implications of geosciences, including risk communication and other issues at the geoscience-society interface.

I was a Professor of geology and applied geology at the Rome University "Sapienza" and Viterbo "Tuscia" (2008-2011). I have participated in European projects as Work-Package/Task leader and member of advisory boards, and collaborated with Universities, Research Institutes, and geoscience organizations, teaching courses on disaster risk reduction, sustainability, and geoethics. I also worked as consultant geologist in the fields of seismic microzonation, subsoil investigations for building construction and infrastructures, and risk mitigation of historical monuments. From 2007 to 2011, I was CEO of an engineering company, aiming to develop methodologies for protecting built and natural environments. I was IUGS Councilor (2018-2022), Chair of the Ethical Advisory Board of ICOS - Integrated Carbon

Observation System (2017-2023), and member of the Executive Committees of several geoscience organizations.

Currently, I serve as Chair of the IUGS Commission on Geoethics, Secretary General of the International Association for Promoting Geoethics, Chairholder on Geoethics of the International Council for Philosophy and Human Sciences, Director of the School on Geoethics and Natural Issues, as well as member of the Climate Intervention Research Advisory Board of the American Geophysical Union, Editorin-Chief of the SpringerBrief in Geoethics and the Journal of Geoethics and Social Geosciences, and member of the Standing Committee for Gender Equality in Science within the International Science Council. I'm also a science writer for newspapers and magazines, and author of books on geosciences for the general public. Finally, I co-authored the Geoethical Promise (the "Hippocratic-like Oath" for geoscientists), and the Cape Town Statement on Geoethics.
